Respected Sir,

This is to bring into your attention an incident of abduction and killing of a poor, marginalized innocent villager from Bansghata village under Bagdah police station area in North 24 Parganas district of West Bengal. At present there was a DG level meeting going on between India and Bangladesh. I am sure that such type of killings will not be discussed there and systematic impunity will go on without hindrance. The victim, a marginalized, innocent villager was fishing in a water body near the Indo-Bangladesh border pillar, when he was taken by the Border Guard of Bangladesh. The next day his dead body was recovered 40 kilometers away with a bullet wound at his back. This incident of killing again proved those bordering populaces are not protected by BSF, as they are posted not in the border, rather sitting well inside Indian territory.

The water body in which he was fishing is located inside the Indian territory. According to local villagers, the incident of abduction and killing of an Indian civilian has been incited as revenge by the BGB, for another previous incident, where the BSF similarly arrested and killed a Bangladeshi civilian about two months ago. The brutal incident raises several questions on the safety and security of the Indian citizens residing along the border. Our concern is:

- How can armed forces from the neighboring country enter Indian territory and abduct and kill a Indian citizen without any obstruction?
- Why was BSF not posted at the international border to contain intruders from entering Indian territory?
- Why was BSF not able to protect the integrity of the international border?
- Who is responsible for the safety and security of the Indian citizen residing at the border villages?
- Who kept the body of Prasenjit in Indian territory?

All such queries have a common answer – BSF is posted inside the fencing, in the villages. Hence the lives and property of bordering villagers are in peril.

The incident not only violated the rights guaranteed in Article 21 of Indian Constitution but also the premise of Article 6 of International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights as well as the Goal No. 8 and 16 of Sustainable Development Goal earmarked by United Nations and in both these international instruments; the government of India is a party and has agreed.

Our immediate demand is -

- The whole incident must be investigated by a neutral agency appointed by the commission
- The victim's family should be duly compensated
- BSF should guard the actual borders and not be stationed inside villages
- BSF Company Commandant of Nowdapara BSF outpost, Battalion 107 shall be booked for causing death by negligence.

Details of the victim-

1. ProsenjitPramanik, Son of Late JagabandhuPramanik, aged about 28 years, village - Bansghata, under Bagdah block and police station area, North 24 Parganas district.

Details of the victim-

1. ShyamaliPramanik, wife of ProsenjitPramanik, aged about 22 years, (Pregnant at present) village - Bansghata, under Bagdah block and police station area, North 24 Parganas district.
2. JoydipPramanik, son of ProsenjitPramanik, aged about 2 years, village - Bansghata, under Bagdah block and police station area, North 24 Parganas district.
3. KalidasiPramanik, mother of ProsenjitPramanik, aged about 50 years, village - Bansghata, under Bagdah block and police station area, North 24 Parganas district.

Date and Time of the incident – On 30.08.2020, at around 6:00pm to 31.08.20, 9:00 am

Place of the incident – Bhalkibil near Nowdapara border outpost and 26 no. gate of Bansghata border

Details of the perpetrators – BGB personnel attached with Andul post of Daulatpur in Bangladesh & 2) Company Commandant of Nowdapara BSF outpost, Battalion 107.

Details of the incident - On 30.08.20, ProsenjitPramanick, a fisherman by profession, went to Bagdah to see a doctor as he was a bit sick. After visiting the doctor he went to his in-laws' place in Nowdapara village, to bring back his wife and son who were already there. The village of Nowdapara is located near the Indo-Bangladesh border, with the international fencing and fencing gates. Prosenjit's in-laws' house is located across the fencing, where there are around 40 other households. Prosenjit submitted his voter ID card and Aadhar Card at the Nowdapara BSF outpost, as such is the protocol set by the BSF, before crossing the border fence. During the evening that day, he went to the Bhalkibil, a water body located just beside his in-laws' house, with the purpose of fishing. Prosenjit casted his fishing net in the Bhalkibil and sat by the water body in the Indian side. Here it might be mentioned that the water body is stretched within Indian and Bangladeshiland with no boundaries. At around 6:30 pm as Prosenjit was fishing in the Bhalkibil, few personnel from the BGB came from the Andul post of Daulatpur in Bangladesh and arrested Prosenjit. He was then taken to Bangladesh by the BGB personnel. The in-laws and other family members of Prosenjit informed the incident of abduction to the local panchayet members and also to the Nowdapara BSF BOP.

The next day on 31.08.20, Prosenjit's dead body was recovered from near gate number 26, under Bansghata BSF BOP, which is about 40 kilometers away from Nowdapara. Few peasants who went to their fields in the morning saw Prosenjit's dead body lying near the International Border Pillar (IBP) with a bullet wound in his back. The locals couldn't identify his dead body as his body was mutilated from torture. At around 7:00 am police from Bagdah police station came to the spot and sent the body for autopsy at the Bongaon sub-divisional hospital. Prosenjit's family and relatives were not present during the autopsy. Later his body was cremated on 1.09.20.

According to few locals, BSF personnel from Bansghata BSF BOP, Battalion 107, on 03.07.20, arrested 24-year old Md. Riya Moral, Son of Mr. Katu Moral of Bangladesh for smuggling and shot him dead. His body was similarly disposed near the gate number 26, on Bangladesh side. According to Mr. Arab Sheikh, a local, the BGB killed ProsenjitPramanik in order to serve revenge for the death of Md. Riya Moral as the BGB personnel posted in Bangladesh during the incident of Md. Riya is now posted at Andul of Doulatpur in Bangladesh now.

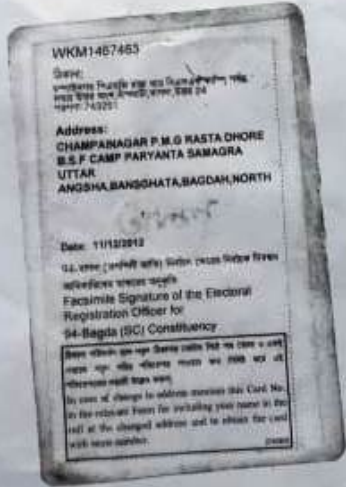
On 7.09.20, Ms. KalidasiPramanik, Prosenjit's mother lodged a written complaint in the Bagdah police station, undersigned by more than 150 villagers. The complaint was accepted by the on-duty police officer but no proceedings were initiated due to the absence of the Officer-in-charge.
